What to Expect

The Interview

In this one hour meeting we take the time to get to know each other a bit both personally and professionally. We will discuss your goals for the project and determine whether or not our goals, timelines and budgets align before we schedule the next meeting.

What to bring

- General measurements of the space
- Inspiration Items or Images

Phase I - Dive

We have met and decided that we are a design match made in heaven! Yay! Let's dive into it! This meeting will be conducted in the space. The next step is getting detailed and accurate measurements. This is one of the most important steps in the beginning of the process as the design can alter significantly due to mismeasured spaces. After initial greetings, I ask that you allow me some quiet time in the space without distractions so that we can perform a thorough job of measuring and documenting the space (time required depends on the square footage and scope of the project). There will be time after measurements for more of a deep dive into the big picture and the next steps of the process.

What you get

- Onsite measurements
- Computer generated line drawings of up to three general layout options
- Mood board-fixture finishes, lighting and color palette suggestions
- *At this point you have the option to stop here (you are able to keep printed documents) or keep moving forward for more detailed design work

Phase II - Swim

Ideally, since our last meeting we have found a direction we want to go with the design now it's time to really dive deep into materials, colors, textures and finishes. We have had the necessary conversations since the second design meeting and I am well into the design at this point. I have the layout established as well as cabinetry, flooring, tile countertops and fixtures ready to present.

The design layout is more detailed according to the measurements taken onsite and I am able to provide accurate finish material quantities and material pricing that you will need to complete your project. I will present a more accurate digital representation of what the space will look like based on the selections we have talked about so far.

What you get

- Constructions documents with measurements & install notes
- Cabinet Layout (if applicable)
- Countertop Template for cabinets (if applicable)
- Electrical map
- Plumbing map
- Tile & Flooring install map
- List of all fixtures and finishes selected with quantities, pricing and resources
- Up to three design revisions
- * Any additional major changes will result in additional design fees.
- *Full payment required for the full release of documents
